CHRISTMAS CONCERT AND NATIVITY

FABULOUS FOLS CONTINUED

This academic year (2017-2018) FoLS have donated a whopping £5,519.68 to school. Most of the money goes towards school trips, which are heavily subsidised, as well as paying for visitors to come to school such as our soldier actor, who taught the Key Stage 2 children about the First and Second World Wars. We visit the pantomime in Oxford every other year and in the year when we do not go to the panto we have a whole school trip to Oxford's Sheldonian Theatre to hear a full orchestra play popular classical hits.

Last year FoLS bought school 15 new laptops as well as numerous other resources such as play equipment for the younger children. This year they have paid for new science, art and design technology equipment, which will be used by all the children at school.

Our teachers (and children) also benefit greatly through many online teaching, learning and assessment resources, that FoLS pay for. This helps make the lessons fun and interesting for the children, and it also ensures that our assessment and tracking of the children's progress is the best it can be.

FoLS recently held their AGM at school. Michelle Carpenter-Hanson, who has worked so enthusiastically and tirelessly over the years, has now stepped down as Chair to be replaced by Lynne Power and Katrina Coles, who will share the position. However, Michelle has agreed to stay on for the next 12 months as Treasurer. Mel Jones is the new Secretary. FoLS are always looking for new recruits and anyone who would like to join would be made to feel very welcome.

I would like to thank Michelle for the phenomenal amount of money she has helped to raise. We are only a small school but FoLS raise a spectacular amount year after year, much more than any other school that I know of. Michelle is passionate about education and the welfare of all children at our school, and this explains her drive, determination and dedication. She has conquered the Three Peaks Challenge, has run the London marathon, has nearly been swept away by strong winds while trying to pitch a marquee at last summer's fun day, all to raise money for school. She has supported the school in many ways behind-the-scenes. For example, during the last Ofsted inspection in June 2016, she explained fluently and carefully how a school like ours ticks all the boxes when it came to diversity — you certainly made an impression on the inspector. Michelle, you deserve a medal. You are a true friend of Lewknor School. Thank you.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT

From April 2015, the threshold figure which forms part of the tax credit free school meal eligibility category is £16,190. Pupils whose parents/carers receive the following support payments are entitled to free school meals (assuming the parent does not receive Working Tax Credit). Under the current criteria, children who receive, or whose parents receive one or more of the following support payments are entitled to receive free school meals and eligible for two-year-old funding:-

- Income-based and contribution-based Jobseekers Allowance or ESA on an equal basis
- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Working Tax Credit, provided they have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190 per year (eligible for two Year Old Funding only)
- Universal Credit

If you believe your child may be eligible to receive free school meals, please complete an application form and return it to the school office **as soon as possible**. Application forms can be downloaded from the school website or found in paper form in the letter rack at school. There is a very simple, confidential, process we can run through Oxfordshire County Council to check eligibility.
