### **NEW UNIFORM SUPPLIER**

I'm please to announce that Florence & Fred Uniform Embroidery Service (Tesco) will be supplying our embroidered school uniform from now on.

We have introduced a jade green polo shirt, which will be phased in over the next two years. So by April 2019, all children will be required to wear a jade green polo shirt. An updated Uniform Policy will be uploaded to the school website shortly.

You will note that there are some additional optional items that will be available to parents to purchase: a navy beanie hat, rucksack, jersey cardigan, hoodie (for PE only) and reversible school coat, all with our school logo embroidered on them.

Uniform can be ordered online (no minimum quantity) and delivered to you at home in approximately 28 days (14 days if ordered between November and May) for £3 per order, or free if you're a Delivery Saver customer with Tesco. Tesco offer free returns and you can earn Clubcard points on orders too.

Our search for a new uniform supplier has taken a little longer than we had hoped, however it was important that we found a supplier who could offer the items, quality and delivery we are looking for at a reasonable price to parents. The school will also benefit as Tesco will donate 5% of the total amount of orders received to the school.

#### FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT

From April 2015, the threshold figure which forms part of the tax credit free school meal eligibility category is £16,190.

Pupils whose parents/carers receive the following support payments are entitled to free school meals (assuming the parent does not receive Working Tax Credit).

Under the current criteria, children who receive, or whose parents receive one or more of the following support payments are entitled to receive free school meals and eligible for two-year-old funding:-

- Income-based and contribution-based Jobseekers Allowance or ESA on an equal basis
- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Working Tax Credit, provided they have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190 per year (eligible for two Year Old Funding only)
- Universal Credit

If you believe your child may be eligible to receive free school meals, please complete an application form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. Application forms can be downloaded from the school website or found in paper form in the letter rack at school. There is a very simple, confidential, process we can run through Oxfordshire County Council to check eligibility.

### **Next Bag 2 School Textile Recycling Collection**

### Monday 15th May 2017

Our next Bag 2 School Textile Recycling collection will be on **MONDAY 15TH MAY**. Collection bags will be sent out the week we come back after the Easter holidays, however if you are having a clear out over Easter or have several bags then please feel free to bag them up in other strong carrier bags or bin liners. Please note that all items are for **RE-USE** and must be clean and in good condition. The list of what they do and don't accept is shown below - **please** note they currently accept bed linen, curtains and towels as well as the usual clothes, shoes, soft toys, handbags, hats etc.

Please bring all items for collection to school by **9am on Monday 15th May**. If you are unable to bring your bags to school on the collection date or have problems storing your filled bags then please speak to Catherine Gallacher (mum to Hattie) or Fiona (Mum to Rosie and Jess) and they will arrange to store them for you.

Bag 2 School accept the following 'good quality' items for RE-USE:

- •Men's, Ladies and Children's clothing
- •Paired shoes (tied together or elastic band around)
- Handbags
- Hats
- Bags
- Scarves and ties
- Jewellery
- Lingerie
- Socks
- Belts
- Soft toys
- Household linen
- Curtains
- Towels

Bedding (bed sheets, pillow cases and duvet covers)

#### They **DO NOT** accept:

- Duvets and blankets
- Pillows and cushions
- •Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)
- Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing
- School uniforms with and without logo
- Corporate clothing and workwear
- •Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material





As well as raising vitally needed funds for our school, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. In addition it also helps to raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.
