





CHILDREN GET A LESSON IN CHURCH BELL-RINGING

Lewknor Primary children were invited to watch a group of bell-ringers who were visiting St Margaret's Church last week. The bell-ringers travel all over the country to visit churches and this week they are planning to ring the bells in 40 churches.

There are six bells in the tower at St Margaret's and some of them bear inscriptions such as 'Feare God', 'Hope in God' and 'Prayes God'. One bell dates back to 1744 and in 1950 a treble bell was added.

The children were impressed with the amount of effort the bell-ringers had to put in to ring the bells—it certainly looked like a strenuous exercise.

FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT

From April 2015, the threshold figure which forms part of the tax credit free school meal eligibility category is £16,190.

Pupils whose parents/carers receive the following support payments are entitled to free school meals (assuming the parent does not receive Working Tax Credit). Under the current criteria, children who receive, or whose parents receive one or more of the following support payments are entitled to receive free school meals and eligible for two-year-old funding:-

- Income-based and contribution-based Jobseekers Allowance or ESA on an equal basis
- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Working Tax Credit, provided they have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190 per year (eligible for two Year Old Funding only)
- Universal Credit

If you believe your child may be eligible to receive free school meals, please complete an application form and return it to the school office **as soon as possible**. Application forms can be downloaded from the school website or found in paper form in the letter rack at school. There is a very simple, confidential, process we can run through Oxfordshire County Council to check eligibility.

Our next Bag 2 School Textile Recycling collection will be on **TUESDAY 22ND MAY 2018**. Collection bags will be sent out in the next week, however feel free to bag them up in other strong carrier bags or bin liners if you need additional bags or are having a clear out before then. Please note that all items are for **RE-USE** and must be clean and in good condition. The list of what they do and don't accept is shown below - **please note they currently accept bed linen, curtains and towels as well as the usual clothes, shoes, soft toys, handbags, hats etc.**

Please bring all items for collection to school by **9am on Tuesday 22nd May**. If you are unable to bring your bags to school on the collection date or have problems storing your filled bags then please speak to Fiona (mum to Jess) and she will arrange to store them for you.

Bag 2 School accept the following 'good quality' items for RE-USE:

- Men's, Ladies' and Children's clothing
- Paired shoes (tied together or elastic band around)
- Handbags
- Hats
- Bags
- Scarves and ties
- Jewellery
- Lingerie
- Socks
- Belts
- Soft toys
- Household linen
- Curtains
- Towels
- Bedding (bed sheets, pillow cases and duvet covers)

They **DO NOT** accept:

- Duvets and blankets
- Pillows and cushions
- Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)
- Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing
- School uniforms with and without logo
- Corporate clothing and workwear
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material




