Some children shared their favourite books with grandparents through Zoom or FaceTime sessions. We hoped this helped to send a positive message about books and reading even in lockdown!



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








Pictured above is some lovely artwork from sisters Thea and Aria. Thea made the Harry Potter Potato, while Aria made Supertato. They look GREAT!






Above: Camille is focusing hard on her geography project

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These photographs show Francis making an art sculpture, above left.


