FOOTBALL FRIENDLY RESULTS IN LEWKNOR WIN!

Coach Louis, who helps to run our PE sessions, arranged a Key Stage 1 (plus some Year 3s) seven-aside football friendly with Chalgrove Primary, one of our partnership schools. This was the first time the children had played together as a team and they won 3-0. The goal scorers were Laurence, who scored one goal, and Noah, who scored two. All the children played extremely well and had a lot of fun. Football is very popular at school and we run two lunchtime clubs plus an after-school football club on Tuesdays. Louis hopes to arrange a Key Stage 2 match with Chalgrove after Easter. Priority for the team will go to those children who love their football, ie, those who participate in the after-school and lunchtime clubs.

HAPPY SNAPPERS PUT ON PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBITION



Many thanks to Luarena, who organised our after-school photography club (see photo above). Over six weeks, the children were introduced to the basics of photography including how a camera works, composition and light. In the main the club concentrated on what makes a good photograph including: cropping, texture, leading lines, interest, beauty and the rule of thirds. The children used still life set-ups and artificial light to explore these ideas, and then also nature and natural lighting to further develop their skills.

Luarena said: "The children were amazing and very open to receiving constructive criticism of their work. I was so happy to see their enthusiasm at improving and how well they took on board instruction and advice about their work."

The children learnt how to improve their photographs by reviewing, deleting and re-taking until they were happy with the results. They learnt to pause, look and plan their imagery before pressing the shutter. Luarena added: "This was a huge contrast to the first week where it seemed like they were using their cameras like machine guns, taking a dozen images before even thinking about what they were doing."

One week the children spent time adjusting and enhancing their photographs with Adobe Photoshop, using just a few techniques to improve the contrast, colour and crop of the images before the photos were sent to print at a professional lab. At the last session the children learnt about long exposures and they played with torch patterns in the dark.

The children's work can be seen mounted and displayed in the intervention room at school.

Ideas for a 'healthy' lunchbox.....



A healthy packed lunch should include something from each of the four main food groups -

starchy carbohydrates (bread, rice, potatoes, pasta), fruit and vegetables, protein containing foods (meat, fish, eggs and beans), and milk and dairy foods – as well as a drink. Here are some ideas of items for each group:

Starchy carbohydrates

A sandwich/roll/wrap/pitta bread (trying using wholegrain varieties or 50/50)

Pasta/couscous/rice

Protein filling

Lean meat/chicken/turkey (add lettuce or tomatoes!)

Fish/tuna (add cucumber or peppers!)

Eggs

Beans

Fruit and vegetables

Chop raw vegetable crudités such as carrot sticks which can be great for dipping in hummus

Fresh fruit (apple, grapes, banana, kiwi)

Dried fruits (raisins, apricots)

Dairy

Low fat yoghurt – plain or fruit (watch out for those high in sugar!)

Small pot of rice pudding

Low fat cheese slices

Added extras

Plain popcorn or reduced fat crisps

Sugar-free jelly pot

A plain biscuit

(There's nothing wrong with this, just try to make healthier choices when you can)

Put in a drink – It is important to stay hydrated, so give your child a bottle of plain water, plain milk (skimmed or semi-skimmed), or no added-sugar fruit juice

FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT

From April 2015, the threshold figure which forms part of the tax credit free school meal eligibility category is £16,190.

Pupils whose parents/carers receive the following support payments are entitled to free school meals (assuming the parent does not receive Working Tax Credit). Under the current criteria, children who receive, or whose parents receive, one or more of the following support payments are entitled to receive free school meals and eligible for two-year-old funding:-

- Income-based and contribution-based Jobseekers Allowance or ESA on an equal basis
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Working Tax Credit, provided they have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190 per year (eligible for two-year-old funding only)
- Universal Credit

If you believe your child may be eligible to receive free school meals, please complete an application form and return it to the school office **as soon as possible**. Application forms can be downloaded from the school website or found in paper form in the letter rack at school. There is a very simple, confidential, process we can run through Oxfordshire County Council to check eligibility.

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




