And talking of getting back to normal...we are planning to start running a mile again every week after the February half-term holiday. The children in the Infants' class (pictured above) have already been practising running a mile twice a week round the playground so they should be super fit.

All the children (and teachers / teaching assistants) take part though the children in the Reception class will join the older children after Easter.

The children run up to the village hall and do several circuits of the field before running back to school. The children start off with warm-up exercises in the playground and after the mile run they gather again in the playground for some gentle cool-down stretches.

We always encourage the children to take things at a pace they are comfortable with and some may prefer to jog gently or walk for parts, but by the end of several weeks all children will have noticed an improvement in their fitness levels.
