The couple bought a house back in March 2020 so that they could be closer to Mark's elderly mother. George will be working in another village school from September teaching Year 5 and 6 again.

George is an outstanding teacher and we have been very lucky to have her as part of our team since September 2015. She is an enthusiastic and energetic teacher and has the ability to inspire all the children. She always works hard (and long hours) and is determined that all children in her care should experience success.

Miss Lawes is very creative. She is a writer, an artist and a musician. She sings and plays guitar performing at local venues and at festivals around the country. She has transformed the singing at Lewknor Primary, leading the whole school in singing practice every week. She has helped organise some lovely school events over the years such as the annual community concert, the Christmas Big Sing at Oxford Town Hall, several performances by our school choir at Dorchester Cathedral, visits of our school choir to local care homes and numerous school productions to celebrate Harvest Festival, Christingle, Mother's and Father's Days, Christmas and Year 6 leavers' assembly. One production I will always remember is when her class performed the whole of Macbeth in a 30-minute assembly - impressive. George also organised a number of visitors to school to help with her teaching as well as to inspire the children. We have had several professional artists, a sculptor and various musicians including a whole school African drumming day.

Miss Lawes is also very interested in science and she took charge of the science curriculum at school. There is now a more coherent approach to assessment, children have more opportunities to learn through science investigations and experiments, and the children say they really enjoy their science lessons. Children in all year groups attain highly in science at school. Miss Lawes also worked closely with scientists at the Rutherford Appleton Laboratory at Harwell in south Oxfordshire. She organised several school trips to the lab where the children learned all about space and dark matter.




