## **Funding allocation**

Schools' allocations are calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil from Reception to Year 6.

As the catch-up premium has been designed to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by coronavirus (COVID-19), the grant will only be available from the 2020 to 2021 academic year.

The total DfE Catch-Up funding for Lewknor Primary is £7,440.

#### **Use of Funds**

Schools should use this funding for specific activities to support their pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months. Schools have the flexibility to spend their funding in the best way for their cohort and circumstances. At Lewknor Primary, we use the Education Endowment Foundation Teaching and Learning Toolkit to help us decide how to improve learning outcomes.
