### LEST WE FORGET—REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE

Husband and wife team Maurice and Lucinda Britnell dressed up as World War One cavalry soldiers and rode their horses, 16-year-old Abbie and 14-year-old Blye into the school playground.

Mr Britnell said the service was particularly moving for him because one of his ancestors, who died in the First World War, came from the Lewknor area. Albert Britnell, who served with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion Berkshire, died on the first day of the Battle of Loos on the Western Front on 25<sup>th</sup> September 1915. He was only 24 years old.

Another relative, Arnold Jellis (see picture) was killed near Dunkirk on 30<sup>th</sup> August 1917. He was an acting bombardier in the Royal Field Artillery and he would have had to 'drive' six horses carrying heavy guns.

Mr Britnell explained that some of the cavalry horses would have had to carry 18 stone of provisions including camp beds, water and ammunition. 250,000 horses died on the Western Front but surprisingly the majority died of malnutrition rather than from battle wounds.

Mr Britnell said this is the first year he and his wife have dressed their horses as war horses and on Sunday they took part in the Remembrance Day parade in Chinnor. The couple are supporting the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal.

The children were asked to mark the 100th anniversary of the Armistice in 1918, which signalled the end of World War One, by showing respect to those who gave the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom.

Heidi, Freya, Ralph and Tara read prayers and poetry, and Peter thanked everyone for coming along to share what was quite an emotional experience.

The children's behaviour was impeccable during the two minutes' silence and they sang Where Have All The Flowers Gone beautifully.

Thank you to all the staff, who helped prepare the children for the assembly and especially to Mrs Wakefield, who organises the Remembrance Service every year.

A huge thanks to Mrs Ashby, who contacted the Britnells and invited them to come to our school. This is one day that I will never forget.

### WANTED...NEW PARENT GOVERNOR CONTINUED!

We are especially looking for people with any of the following skills: financial, analytical and strategic.

If you have any questions please feel free to contact us via the school email. Mrs Jackson and Mrs Seston, our current parent governors, would also be available to talk to you about the role of parent governor in the playground.

If you would like to stand as a candidate, please complete and return the nomination form, included at the back of this newsletter. Please put the form in a sealed envelope (marked Parent Governor Nomination Form) and pop it into the school post box to arrive no later than 3.15pm on Friday 30<sup>th</sup> November. Please also include a short statement about yourself including reasons why you wish to become a school governor and how you can contribute to the work of the governing body.

If more than one parent applies then we would hold an election and all parents would be invited to vote for a candidate.

All new governors are required by law to undergo a check on their suitability to serve. This will be a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check.

#### **Eligibility to stand**

All parents at the school are eligible to stand as candidates except:

- If s/he is an elected member of the local education authority (county councillor);
- If s/he is paid to work at the school for more than 500 hours in any 12 month period beginning on 1<sup>st</sup>
  August and finishing on 31<sup>st</sup> July (during one academic year).

### Some Facts about our Governing Body

#### What is the composition of the Governing Body?

The governing body consists of parent governors, staff governor, the head teacher, foundation governors, three co-opted governors, a local authority governor and an associate governor. Our school currently has two parent governors (one vacancy). Parent governors have all the same powers and duties as other governors. Governor information, which includes a list of governors and their roles, is available on our school website. The Clerk to Governors is Sarah Uhart.

### How much time will it take up?

The full governing body meets five times a year. Most meetings run from 7pm to 9pm except for the July meeting which is held straight after school. If possible, every governor joins at least one of our three committees, for example, resources, teaching and learning, and pay and performance. The resources committee meets five times a year, while the teaching and learning committee meets three times a year. We invite governors to come into school occasionally during the school day so they can see how the school operates. Governors also help out at school events such as parent evenings.

### What do governors actually do?

Governors are responsible for the strategic direction of the school: they make long-term decisions about the progress and the development of the school. Governors may help to appoint senior staff, they make decisions about the school's budget, they decide on policies for every aspect of the school, and they set targets for pupil attainment, progress and attendance. Governors ensure that the school provides the highest standard of education for every child.

### Can I get help to understand what happens at meetings?

Yes. The Chair will meet new governors before their first meeting to talk through the agenda. New governors would be expected to attend the induction course provided by Oxfordshire's Governor Services so that you are fully aware of your role.

### Can I talk to parents or other people about what goes on in meetings?

You can talk about matters in a very general way, but you must not identify any individual member of staff or any child. As the governing body acts as a 'corporate body' you cannot talk about any differences of opinion during the meeting, you can only report the final decision of the governing body. Part of the agenda is strictly confidential (it might cover special educational needs or exclusions) and you must not talk about anything discussed during these sessions. Governors are asked to agree to a Code of Conduct that will be explained at your first meeting.

### What are the benefits of becoming a governor?

You will learn how the school manages its budget, personnel and buildings, and how school policies are developed.

#### What are the restrictions on becoming a governor?

Governors must be over 18 years of age; not be bankrupt, nor have served a long prison sentence, nor have been disqualified from working with children.

### Ideas for a 'healthy' lunchbox.....



A healthy packed lunch should include something from each of the four main food groups -

starchy carbohydrates (bread, rice, potatoes, pasta), fruit and vegetables, protein containing foods (meat, fish, eggs and beans), and milk and dairy foods - as well as a drink. Here are some ideas of items for each group:

### Starchy carbohydrates

A sandwich/roll/wrap/pitta bread (trying using wholegrain varieties or 50/50) Pasta/couscous/rice

### **Protein filling**

Lean meat/chicken/turkey (add lettuce or tomatoes!)

Fish/tuna (add cucumber or peppers!)

Eggs

Beans

### Fruit and vegetables

Chop raw vegetable crudités such as carrot sticks which can be great for dipping in hummus Fresh fruit (apple, grapes, banana, kiwi) Dried fruits (raisins, apricots)

### Dairy

Low fat yoghurt - plain or fruit (watch out for those high in sugar!) Small pot of rice pudding Low fat cheese slices Added extras

Plain popcorn or reduced fat crisps Sugar-free jelly pot A plain biscuit (There's nothing wrong with this, just try to make healthier choices when you can)

Put in a drink – It is important to stay hydrated, so give your child a bottle of plain water, plain milk (skimmed or semi -skimmed), or no added-sugar fruit juice

### FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT

From April 2015, the threshold figure which forms part of the tax credit free school meal eligibility category is £16,190.

Pupils whose parents/carers receive the following support payments are entitled to free school meals (assuming the parent does not receive Working Tax Credit). Under the current criteria, children who receive, or whose parents receive, one or more of the following support payments are entitled to receive free school meals and eligible for two-year-old funding:-

- Income-based and contribution-based Jobseekers Allowance or ESA on an equal basis
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Working Tax Credit, provided they have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190 per year (eligible for two-year-old funding only)
- Universal Credit

If you believe your child may be eligible to receive free school meals, please complete an application form and return it to the school office **as soon as possible**. Application forms can be downloaded from the school website or found in paper form in the letter rack at school. There is a very simple, confidential, process we can run through Oxfordshire County Council to check eligibility.

Please note that all items are for **RE-USE** and must be clean and in good condition. The list of what they do and don't accept is shown below - **please note they currently accept bed linen, curtains and towels as well as the usual clothes, shoes, soft toys, handbags, hats etc.** 

Please bring all items for collection to school by **9am on Tuesday 13th November**. If you are unable to bring your bags to school on the collection date or have problems storing your filled bags then please speak to Fiona (mum to Jess) and she will arrange to store them for you.

Bag 2 School accept the following 'good quality' items for RE-USE:

- Men's, Ladies' and Children's clothing
- Paired shoes (tied together or elastic band around)
- Handbags
- Hats
- Bags
- Scarves and ties
- Jewellery
- Lingerie
- Socks
- Belts
- Soft toys
- Household linen
- Curtains
- Towels
- Bedding (bed sheets, pillow cases and duvet covers)

### They **DO NOT** accept:

- Duvets and blankets
- Pillows and cushions
- Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)
- Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing
- School uniforms with and without logo
- Corporate clothing and workwear
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material

As well as raising vitally needed funds for our school, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted, textiles away from landfill. In addition it also helps to raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.




