
Those that win the reading raffle are allowed to bring in their favourite toy from home for a special treat.

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BASIA'S LATEST BRILLIANT BRAINWAVE







YEAR 6 SATs SUPERSTARS!



All children in Year 6 throughout the country sit a number of tests every year in May. The tests include: reading comprehension, spelling, punctuation and grammar, and three maths papers (one arithmetic and two problem-solving/ reasoning). Our children are always well-prepared for these tests and end up performing extremely well (school always achieves well above national and county averages).

I often think the parents are much more worried than the children ever are when it comes to sitting SATs though it does help to have a lovely teacher like Miss Baker, who bakes special treats for the children to have after each test. 
help prepare for an event, run a stall, bake a cake, donate a raffle prize, support events by attending, spread the word to advertise events,
