MATHS MASTERS - INFANTS SHOW THEY HAVE A KNACK FOR NUMBERS!




Above: Charlie works on place value—easy peasy!



PHONICS - RECEPTION CHILDREN LEARN THEIR LETTER SOUNDS


Phonics sessions begin promptly right at the start of the school day shortly after 9am. The children have already learned 12 different letter sounds and they have only been at school for just over three weeks. Once the children learn the sound of each letter, they then practise writing the letter on their individual white boards.
