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Evacuation letter from 1945...

42. Warwick Avenue, Paddington, London. W.9.

August 3rd. 1945.

Dear Mrs Scott,

I am writing on behalf of the Managers of St. Saviour's School, Paddington to express the deep appreciation of all concerned here, the School authorities, the Church and the parents, for all that has been done for the evacuated children of this area during the difficult period of evacuation.

It has been a time of very great difficulty for your School, we know, but we also knwo how cheerfully you surmounted all the difficulties. Those members of our staff who went with the children wish, particularly, to be associated with this letter.

A special word of praise is due to the faster-parents of the children and we are deeply thankful to them for all the trouble and patience which they have expended on our the trouble and patience which they have expended on our children. The people of London are really deeply touched children. The people of London are really deeply touched the care that has been taken of the children, even by the care that has been taken of the parents may not though the occasional visits of some of the parents may not slways have reflected this spirit very clearly.

I hope you will convey our thanks to those with whom you are in contact.


