We are thrilled to share the exciting news of three new staff members who will be joining us in September.

Firstly, we have Lucrezia, who will be assuming the role of supervisor. Lucrezia has spent an impressive 11-years overseeing the preschool at a local Primary school and brings a wealth of experience and expertise with her.

Next, we are delighted to welcome Ruth as our deputy supervisor. Ruth's extensive background spans over 20 years in managing and working within preschools like our own. Her invaluable experience will undoubtedly contribute to the continued success of our preschool.

Last, but certainly not least, we are pleased to introduce our second deputy, Kerraleigh. With 12 years of running Hartbeeps and prior experience working in nurseries, Kerraleigh has honed her skills in providing excellent care and education to young children. Additionally, her background in drama and singing adds a unique and creative aspect to her abilities.

From September, we will be reopening as Lewknor Preschool. Our new opening hours will be 8.30 - 3.30 Monday to Friday term time. The morning session will run from 8.30 - 11.30. 11.30 - 12.30 is lunch and 12.30 - 3.30 is the afternoon session. Once settled, we hope to extend these to offer further wraparound care and holiday clubs.

There will be an open day on the 20th August to give parents and children the opportunity to meet the new staff before September. Further details of this will be announced shortly.

We will continue to work closely with Lewknor School to create a natural progression to school. We will be planning afternoon sessions for children aged three and above at Lewknor School from next year, with a member of our staff to give them the opportunity to get used to a school setting and ready them for reception.
