IN TOP 5% OF SCHOOLS

I am delighted to inform you that Lewknor Primary is in the top 5% of Oxfordshire schools for our end of Key Stage 2 (Year 6) SATs results. We came joint 15th out of 327 schools for our reading, writing and maths combined score.

Of the 10 children who sat SATs in May last year, 100% reached the expected standard in maths, while 20% reached the higher grade of 'greater depth'. 90% of children reached the expected standard in reading, and 50% gained greater depth.

90% also reached the expected standard in writing, with 40% reaching greater depth.

The children also sat the Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling test and 90% reached the expected standard here too, with 50% making greater depth. I was also very pleased that 100% of our children in Year 1 passed the phonics test. I would like to thank all the wonderful staff because it really is a team effort. And, of course, well done to our children too. They are all SUPERSTARS!
