#### **AGENTS OF CHANGE ADOPT A PANDA**





As part of the diocesan Be The Change campaign to help children become agents of change in responding to the climate and environmental emergency, the pupils in Upper Juniors (Years 5 and 6) organised a whole school mufti day for their class project to help protect pandas. They talked to all the children at school and suggested they wear a black and white costume instead of uniform and donate £1 to help their class adopt a giant panda.

These photographs show the Upper Juniors children teaching the Infant class about the plight of the giant panda. Though they are not considered endangered, they are threatened and the World Wild Fund for Nature works with the Chinese government to set up protected areas to keep more panda habitat intact. The children have learned that the giant panda is found in the wild in just six isolated mountain ranges in Gansu, Shaanxi and Sichuan Provinces in south-central China. Pandas that live in isolated mountains are especially vulnerable to climate change - as they already have small ranges that could shrink and fragment further. Roads and railways are increasingly cutting through the forest, which isolates panda populations and prevents them from breeding. The children produced posters and information sheets (see photos below) to show how adoption can help protect these wonderful creatures.
