#### **ZOFIA IS QUACKERS ABOUT HER DUCKLINGS**



A few weeks ago we brought you the story of how Zofia, pictured left, had rescued two jackdaws from the chimney flue in the Upper Juniors classroom. Well we had more feathered fun at school last week when Zofia brought in three ducklings she is rearing at home.

Animal lover Zofia bought three duck eggs from a local farmer and kept them in an incubator at home. Twenty-six days later the eggs hatched and Zofia had three ducklings which she named Dior (she's a bit of a diva), Tiana and Noodles.

Zofia feeds the ducklings every day—their diet consists of oats, rice, chopped up hard-boiled egg and the odd Weetabix. The ducklings enjoy swimming in a paddling pool Zofia has set up in the kitchen at her home and they sleep under a heat lamp at night.

Alas, Zofia will not be able to keep the ducks for much longer but she has already found a good home for them to go to.

"We go on holiday every year and it would be too difficult to find someone who would be prepared to look after them. But we do know someone who wants to start a bird farm and the ducklings will be going to live with him."

#### LEWKNOR'S ANSWER TO CHELSEA FLOWER SHOW





few months had organised a fun
nature trail for the children, which
included locating a hedgehog house, a
pigeons' nest, a mouse house, a bird
box and a wildlife camera. Each child
was given a laminated sheet which
had photographs of all the items they
had to find.

The children also got the chance to sow their own giant sunflower seeds, which they brought back to school where we will look after them carefully before the children eventually take them home.

Emma said: "I have always enjoyed being part of the community and wanted to offer something to the school. My plan this year is to have a small plant stall at home where people can buy perennial plants, vegetable plants and a few cut flower bunches, all grown and propagated in my garden. The last couple of years I have been involved in the Kingston Blount allotment giant pumpkin competition, propagating 30 seeds and handing them out to the villagers, great fun!"

Our children had a lot of fun visiting the garden (there was lots of laughter and a lot of outdoor learning!). I would like to thank Kevin and Emma for their very kind gesture.


