A member of the FOLS team will be appropriately dressed and armed with a bucket to collect the money as the children come into school.



SCIENCE LESSON IS SUCH A GAS!

The children in the Upper Juniors class have been looking at Living Things and Their Habitats, which is part of the science curriculum. They have been learning all about plants and fungi, including yeast. They knew yeast needed nutrition to grow but they wanted to find out what 'foods' yeast preferred. Some children prepared a mixture of yeast and sugar, some prepared a mixture of yeast and flour, while some mixed yeast with a banana puree. Balloons were attached to the tops of bottles containing the mixtures. The children then compared the results.

The by-product of growing yeast is carbon dioxide and this gas makes the balloons blow up. The children could tell which was yeast's favourite food by seeing which balloons grew bigger.

The children then wrote up their science reports showing their observations and conclusions. And they discovered that yeast prefers...sugar!


