### NEW COVID ISOLATION RULES

From today, Monday 17<sup>th</sup> January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after five full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if a child tests negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school on day 6.

All test results should be reported to NHS test and Trace.

If the result of either of the tests is positive, then the child should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.









#### **UPPER JUNIORS ON A MISSION TO READ, READ, READ**



Some children from the Upper Juniors class with their new reading record books

The Upper Juniors' teacher, Miss Baker, must have spent an entire weekend making reading record books for the children in her class. While each child was able to design the front cover of their book, inside there is page after page of different and fun activities for the children to complete.

The children are expected to write short reviews and rate the books they have read too. They should read a range of genres and books can include audio books and e-books as well as 'physical' books. The children can create comic strips retelling the story they have read or write a diary entry as if they are one of the characters in a book. They are encouraged to list powerful words that they can use in their own story writing in class. The children are encouraged to think deeply about the books. For example, they should consider why the author wrote the book and if they could ask the author a question what would it be?

Miss Baker also recommends a number of books that she thinks the children would enjoy. For Year 5 she lists: Awful Auntie, Billionaire Boy and Demon Dentist—all three books by David Walliams. She also recommends Wolf Brother by Michelle Paver and Skellig by David Almond. For Year 6, Miss Baker recommends: Holes by Louis Sachar, Alone On A Wide, Wide Sea by Michael Morpurgo, The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas by John Boyne and much, much more.


