Headteacher's Welcome

CHILDREN LAP UP FITNESS TEST



The teachers don't just assess the children's English and maths skills but also their fitness and stamina! The children - from the Reception class to Year 6 - take part in the Cooper Run Test three times a year so that teachers can track progress in aerobic fitness. Children in the Reception and Infants classes run laps of the playground for five minutes, while the older children in Lower and Upper Juniors run for 10 minutes. Staff are positioned to keep track of how many laps each child completes, which gives us a good indication of how their fitness improves through the year. One lesson the children learn is that slow and steady, rather than running as fast as possible, can often win the race!



MARCH


Thursday 2nd March: World Book Day. Come to school dressed up as your favourite book character.
