I am sure I will be calling her (hopefully not too soon) to ask if she can sort out some problem!

Last week they made toy cars out of recycled materials. A balloon was attached to the car. If you inflate a balloon it stores potential energy. When you release the balloon this energy is converted to kinetic energy, the energy of motion. The balloons had a straw attached and when the air escapes from the balloon it propels the car. Some of the cars zipped around at great speed!
